

Maharishi Academy Planned for Antrim

About a dozen Antrim officials met Saturday afternoon with board members of the proposed Maharishi Academy of Total Knowledge in Scarborough Hall on the former Hawthorne College campus in the North Branch section of town.

Plans for the proposed “High School for Leadership” for boys have been presented to the Antrim Planning Board and other town officials, and the required site plan review process with the Planning Board is ongoing.

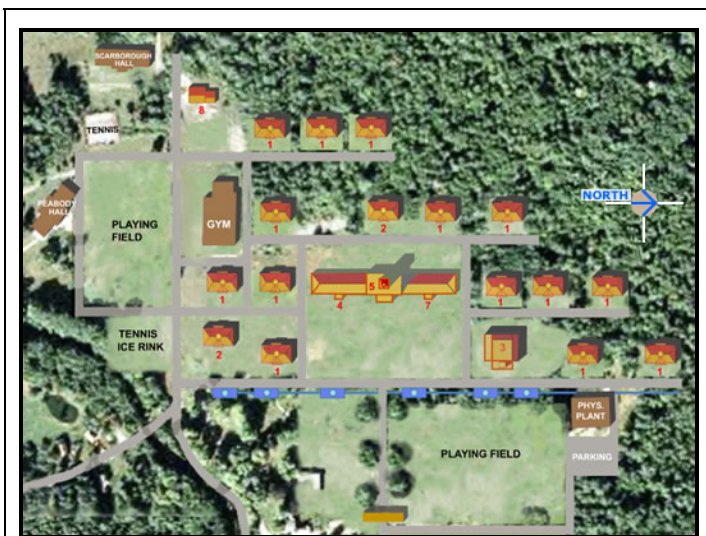
According to a letter from Dr. Daniel Wasielewski, Director of Facilities Development, to Town Planner Bradley Houseworth, “Our facility in Antrim, the former Hawthorne College, has been operating since 1990 under our direction as an office headquarters and as an education residential course campus. We

are now planning a \$37,297,540 expansion and renovation strategy that will add 285,000 square feet of new buildings and at the same time repair existing buildings, thus allowing us to establish a new school for boys.”

The proposed new facility would accommodate 400 (male) students.

The proposed school would be part of the Global Country of World Peace (www.globalcountry.net), which, along with its affiliated organizations, “have been offering health, educational, architectural and agricultural programs to individuals, organizations and governments around the world for 50 years.”
